



Deadline for notifying earthquake damage for house, contents and land
A reminder to make your earthquake claim by Tuesday, 14th February 2017.

If your home, contents or land was damaged by the recent earthquakes, we're here to help. But, you need to make your claim as soon as possible.

The EQC Act gives everyone 90 days to make a claim and the deadline is:
Tuesday, 14th February 2017 - not too far away.

Your insurance company has agreed with the EQC that they will lodge, assess and settle personal home and contents claims, regardless of whether they are under or over EQC's cap.

If you are unsure a claim has been lodged, or you wish to make a claim, please contact Aon and we can help you through this process. Please contact your Aon Broker as soon as possible.

If you already lodged a claim with the Earthquake Commission, you do not need to do anything, the claims have been transferred to your respective private insurer.

Land claims need to be notified directly to the Earthquake Commission as these are unable to be lodged through your insurer. The deadline for land claims to be lodged is also Tuesday, 14th February 2017.

Should your residential land have suffered earthquake damage from the recent events, please contact EQC directly on:
www.eqc.govt.nz or call **0800 DAMAGE (0800 326 243)** to notify them of your claim. EQC will manage land based claims only

If you have no damage and do not need to claim, please just ignore this reminder.

There are no exceptions to this deadline - claims must be received by Tuesday, 14th February.
